.... Several of these men used their influential posts for their own gain. Colonel Charles R. Forbes, an Ohio acquaintance of
 Harding's, sold scarce medical supplies from veterans' hospitals and kept the money for himself. He cost the public about \$250
 million. In June 1923, while traveling from Alaska to California, Harding became ill with what was probably a heart attack. He

died in San Francisco on August 2, shortly before the news of the Forbes scandal broke. Early the next morning, the vice

president, Calvin Coolidge, took the oath of office and became president. The most famous scandal, known as Teapot Dome,

began in early 1922. Harding's secretary of the interior, Albert B. Fall, secretly allowed private interests to lease lands containing


7 U.S. Navy oil reserves at Teapot Dome, Wyoming, and Elk Hills, California. In return, Fall received bribes from these private

interests totaling more than \$300,000. After the Wall Street Journal broke the story, the Senate launched an investigation that

took most of the 1920s to complete. In 1929 Secretary Fall became the first cabinet secretary to go to prison.
